Kindness is Contagious! - Retiree Spotlight

In our last Retiree Times (Aug/Sep) Samm McDonald wrote about kindness in her President's Message. We received several comments about how much it resonated with our members but one alumnus in particular wrote to tell us about how he is trying to spread kindness with his "kindness crusade". We'd like to share his story in our Retiree Spotlight... meet Ron Newell.



- Q: How long ago did you retire? A: I retired in 1994.
- Q: What did you do at SDG&E: A: I was an internal auditor.
- Q. How did you get started on your kindness crusade?

A. After I retired and my wife passed away I started volunteering, first by helping Father Joe Carroll serve food at his kitchen on Sundays with our congregation from Beth Israel (for 22 years) and then also as a San Diego Police Department RSVP volunteer, which I did for 17 years. In January 2018 I attended an event where there were oval shaped button pins on the table with the words "BE KIND". If we would wear them we were invited to take them. Being upset with how our society has become I took two, one for each of my jackets. I was hoping people would approach me and seeing it might they become kinder. What I did not expect was that people would stop me to say they like or love my button. I decided that if people were interested I would share my message with others, so I found out where to order more of the BE KIND buttons. I ordered 100. Then when I was stopped by someone who liked my button I would ask them if they would wear one. If they said yes I gave them a button. I went through the first 100 in a month. I started ordering 500 to get a better price break; I'm on my third batch! I have people actually ordering them from me so they can spread kindness in their world, and actually it is happening around the world. My niece lives in Australia and she took some to distribute after a visit here, a friend's daughter goes to college in South Carolina who took them when she went back, and another friend in Canada shared them over a Thanksgiving meal with family and friends who then took them back to their hometowns. I want to bring them to the SDG&E Alumni Holiday luncheon to share.

Q. How has sharing the buttons changed your life?

A. I find that I treat others more respectfully and kind. Like waiting to let another driver in from a shopping center driveway or unloading a grocery cart with heavy items for a customer behind me. Continued on next page.

Q. What else would you like to do to share your message of "Be kind"?

A. I would love to share this with leaders at SDG&E. If employees were to wear a button while working with customers it could really make a difference in how the company is viewed. I have also thought about contacting the school districts to see if they might be interested in doing something for students.

Q. Is there anything else you would like to share with us?

A. I think that Ellen DeGeneres has such a great message when she ends her show each day. She says "Be kind to one another". I think that is really what it's about. I never used to watch her show but now I watch it everyday!

We would like to thank Ron for sharing his story about how he is dedicated to making the world a kinder place, one person at a time. We look forward to having Ron attend the Holiday luncheon and sharing his buttons with all of us!
